



CANADIAN FEDERATION OF STUDENTS-NOVA SCOTIA JOB POSTING: SUMMER INTERNSHIP (8 WEEK)

The Canadian Federation of Students, Canada's national student movement, is comprised of over 500,000 students from across the country. Students in Canada have been represented by the Canadian Federation of Students and its predecessor organisations since 1927.

DESCRIPTION:

The Federation's Summer Internship is a full-time paid staff position based out of Halifax, Nova Scotia, lasting for 8 weeks. Interns will assist with developing and implementing strategies for delivering campaigns and services to members, assist with on-going research projects, conduct basic office duties, attend special events and may be asked to assist with other work important to the Canadian Federation of Students-Nova Scotia.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Current knowledge of the goals and issues facing the student movement in Canada.
- Experience working within the student movement or other social justice movements.
- Experience in any of the following areas considered an asset: research, writing, event planning, social media.
- Fluency in French is an asset.
- Drivers licence is an asset.
- Must be eligible for the Canada Summer Jobs Program.

LENGTH OF EMPLOYMENT:

The Campaigns Assistant position is an 8 - week contract running from June 7 to July 30. Start and end dates are flexible.
